

JOCELYN EARRINGS



What do you need?

Seed beads 15/0 and 11/0 in two colors. I used Frosted Copper (Cop11/0 and Cop15/0) and Frosted Jet (Jet11/0 and Jet15/0).

Farfalles 30 pieces

Earhooks

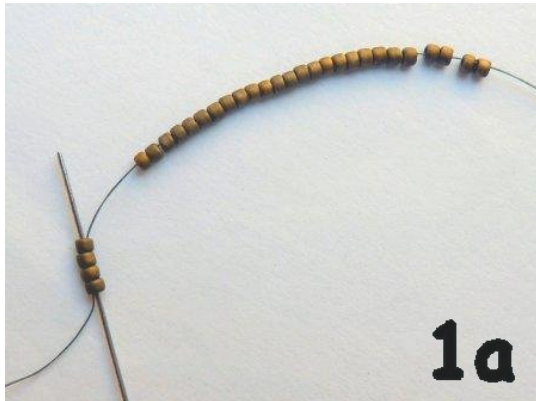
Fireline smoke 0,15

Beading needle 10.

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Step 1

Pick up thirty Cop15/0 (1a) and sew through the first four again to form a circle (1b).



Step 2

Do one round of peyote with Cop15/0. So pick up a Cop15/0, skip one and sew through the next one (2a). After adding the last Cop15/0 of this round, sew through the next Cop15/0 as normal but also through the next one (2b). This is called “stepping up” to get ready for the next round. This is the basis of peyote stitch.

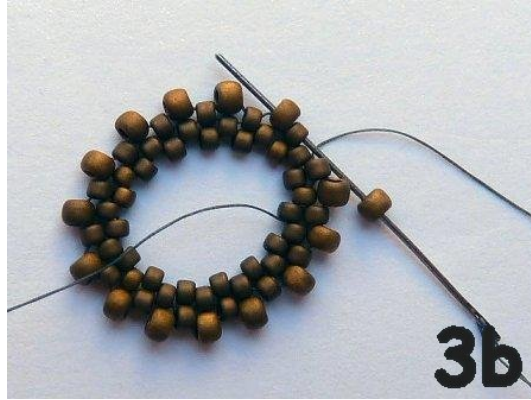
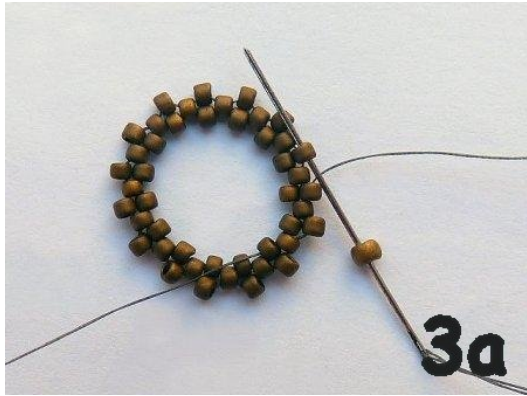


It now looks like picture 2c:



Step 3

Do another round of peyote stitch with Cop11/0 (3a). After adding the last Cop11/0 of this round, sew through the next Cop15/0 as normal but also through the first Cop11/0 you added in this round (3b).



It then looks like picture 3c.



Step 4

Do the next round of peyote stitch with Jet11/0. After adding the last Jet11/0 of this round, sew through the next Cop11/0 as normal but also through the first Jet11/0 you added in this round (4b).



It now looks like picture 4c.



Step 5

Do another round of peyote stitch with Jet11/0 (5a). After adding the last Jet11/0 of this round, sew through the next Jet11/0 as normal but also through the first Jet11/0 you added in this round (5b).



It now looks like in picture 5c.



Step 6

Now do the other side. Sew back through the beads like in picture 6a (the blue line) and end with your thread coming out of a Cop15/0.



Your work starts to get a bit hollow now. Turn it round so that the hollow side faces down (6b). Repeat **Steps 3 to 5**. It now looks like picture 6c.



Step 7

Do a round of peyote stitch with the farfalles (7a). After adding the last farfalle of this round, sew through the next Jet11/0 as normal but also through the first farfalle you added in this round (7b).



It now looks like picture 7c.



Step 8

Now connect the farfalles to the other side as well, so sew through the next Jet 11/0 on the other side (8a). Then sew through the next farfalle (8b). Repeat this step until all around and end with your thread coming out of a farfalle.



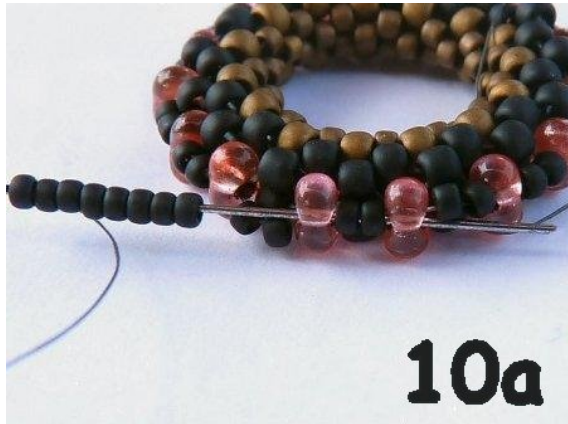
Step 9

Pick up two Jet15/0 and sew through the next farfalle (9a). Continue this step all around. It now looks like picture 9b.

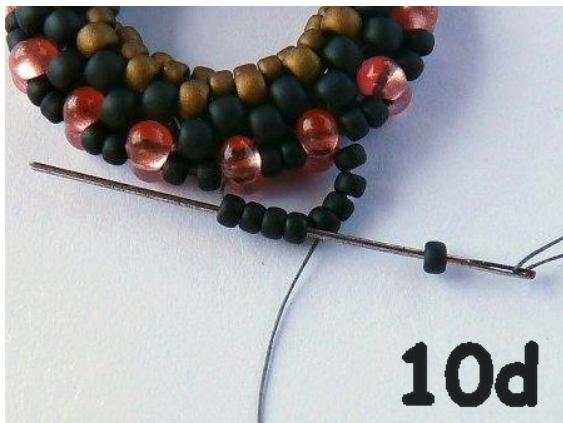


Step 10 Adding the loop for the ear hook

Pick up eight Jet15/0 and sew back through the previous farfalle and two Jet15/0 to make a circle (10a). It now looks like picture 10b.



Sew through the next four Jet15/0 of the loop you just made (10c). Then pick up one Jet15/0 and sew through the next four Jet15/0 of the loop (10d). Sew through all the beads in this step again to reinforce the loop.



And there is your earring (10e)! You just have to hang it of an ear hook of your choice.
